

C11 Campaign Ads/Conceptual Understanding/Experience/Dictionary/Deductive

This task will help you develop a deeper understanding of presidential candidate experience.

Instructions:

- Go to EASE History -- <http://www.easehistory.org/>
- Search on 'Experience' in EASE History. [Campaign Ads Menu>Presidential Leadership Attribute> Positive>Experience]
- Examine at least 10 cases that have been coded on 'Experience'. (In EASE History, campaign ads and historical events are treated as cases.)
- Switch to the Weave viewing mode. (The Weave button is in the upper right hand corner.)
- Column 1: Select four cases that are a good match for each of the five dictionary entries for 'Experience'. A case can be used to illustrate more than one entry.
- Column 2: Three dictionary entries for 'Experience' have been provided.
- Column 3: Describe how each case illustrates the entry for 'Experience'.

Extension Activity: Briefly explain in two or three sentences how the three cases, about each dictionary entry, are sort of similar and sort of different from each other.

Experience

n 1: the accumulation of knowledge or skill that results from direct participation in events or activities; "a man of experience"; "experience is the best teacher"

2: the content of direct observation or participation in an event; "he had a religious experience"; "he recalled the experience vividly"

3: an event as apprehended; "a surprising experience"; "that painful experience certainly got our attention"

v 1: go or live through; "We had many trials to go through"; "he saw action in Viet Nam" [syn: undergo, see, go through]

2: have firsthand knowledge of states, situations, emotions, or sensations; "I know the feeling!"; "have you ever known hunger?"; "I have lived a kind of hell when I was a drug addict"; "The holocaust survivors have lived a nightmare"; "I lived through two divorces" [syn: know, live]
